

Minutes of the NSCNA

7/20/93

A meeting of the North Shoal Creek Neighborhood Association was held at the North Village Branch Library on July 20, 1993. Kenneth Ragsdale was presiding at the meeting.

Sixteen members of the association were present and voting. Dues were collected from nine of those present.

The treasurer, Harold Anderson, informed the group that the association's account balance was \$182.62 as of June 01, 1993.

NEW BUSINESS:

Tomas Rodriguez reviewed the status of the NSCNA objection to a request for a change in zoning from CS to CS-1 for the Spectrum Shopping Center on Burnet Road. The zoning change has been requested by Slick Willies, a Houston based company who desires to place an 11,000 sq foot pool hall in the center. A discussion followed in which the attendees were informed of the actions of Jerry Oakes, President of the association in objecting to the zoning change. It was moved, seconded and unanimously approved with no abstentions or objections, that Jerry Oakes should continue to pursue the associations objections to the zoning change, to the extent of filing an appeal with the Austin City Council to have the rezoning set aside.

Membership Drive: After a discussion of the membership status it was moved, seconded and unanimously approved that Jerry Oakes is authorized to spend up to \$200 of the associations funds in an effort to increase the membership.

There was a brief discussion about the Stripling Blake intercom, and what the association could do to get them to turn it down. No motions were made.

OLD BUSINESS:

Concern was expressed regarding the exposed gas line over Shoal Creek at Steck. The city had agreed last year to approach Southern Union Gas about the line exposed over Shoal Creek. Apparently no action has

been taken. The association officers agreed to contact the City again.

The association officers also agreed to:

- 1) Contact the city regarding the pot holes on Steck Lane.
- 2) Arrange to have the police department send a representative to one of the association meetings to talk about neighborhood watch.
- 3) Contact the Allendale Neighborhood association to request attendance at one of their meetings as guests.
- 4) Send a representative to the Austin Neighborhood Council meetings.

MISCELLANEOUS

Additional methods of raising funds for the association were discussed. Among those were:

- 1) A neighborhood garage sale.
- 2) Participation in the MANja's Pizza benefit fun run (1/3 of which was run through the neighborhood) A water stop was suggested.

In addition it was mentioned that there have been an increasing number of automobile break-ins, especially on Benbrook and Briarwood.

Members agreed to participate in a 'walk thru' to distribute fliers for the next meeting to be held sometime in late September or in October.
