

Congratualtions to Pillow's Teacher of the Year! ALLAN SHROPSHIRE!

The NSCNA would like to congratulate Allan Shropshire who was recently awarded Pillow's Teacher of the Year. Kim Longacre wanted to find our more about this talented teacher who also lives in our neighborhood. She asked him when he started teaching, what influences him and what he considers to be his greatest challenges. Below are his responses.

"I trained to become a teacher at the University of Texas where I received my undergraduate degree in Education. I have been teaching for seven years. Two major influences pointed me toward becoming a teacher. I was fortunate to be "Mr. French"- a nanny for a wonderful family here in Austin. While in that capacity, I met the woman who is now my wife. She has been my mentor and currently teaches a Young Scientist program at Barrington Elementary School in Austin.

After joining the Pillow staff, I began riding my bicycle to work as a New Year's resolution. On my commuter route, I stopped early one morning to look at a flyer for a home on Daleview Drive. Happily, we now live in the same neighborhood where I teach. I can walk to work now. I feel very fortunate to live in this community and teach at a school that reflects the many positive aspects of a diverse population.

I teach a first grade class that accommodates children who speak English as their second language. In my two years, I have had children from The Czech Republic, China, Russia, India, Iran, Mexico, The Philippines. Nigeria, Korea, Denmark as well as native English speakers from the United States. My grandson is also in my class this year.

The overall experience for me at this school and in this neighborhood have made these my happiest years in teaching. I have been asked what the greatest challenges are in teaching and for me that challenge is to continue my professional growth as a teacher and to be wary of complacency. I hope to combine my teaching with my interest in technology as I pursue a master's degree in Instructional Technology."


Seven New Trees Planted at Pillow!

Neighborhood Crime Watch

We are fortunate to live in a safe neighborhood, but we neighbors must actively work to keep it secure. I recently heard that one of our neighbor's dog died when he ate a bag of rat poison that had been thrown in the yard. The best way to prevent crime is to know your neighbors. Below I have listed some services offered by the police department to ensure your home is secure. In upcoming issues we will provide tips on securing your home as well as crime statistics for our neighborhood.

Home Security Surveys

The APD can perform a <u>free</u> home security survey of your home. They will inspect your home against a list of criteria and can point out security risks. If your home "passes" the survey, you will receive a form that you can submit to your insurance company for up to a 20% discount. If you are interested in this service, you can contact our neighborhood liasion at 974-5557.

Form or Reenergize a Neighborhood Watch



Our APD representative will give a two-evening seminar on forming your neighborhood watch. They will talk about ways to secure your home, personal safety, and how to operate your neighborhood watch. This is an excellent way to get to know your neighbors and prevent crime in your area. If you are interested in forming a Neighborhood Watch or are needing a refresher, contact our District Rep at 974-5557.

Help End Auto Theft (HEAT)

The Help End Auto Theft Operation (HEAT) is a statewide vehicle registration program aimed at reducing auto theft during nighttime hours. In Austin, over 40% of all vehicles are stolen in the late evening to early morning hours. If you do not normally drive your vehicle between the hours of 1 a.m. and 5 a.m., you can volunteer to sign an agreement and have two special HEAT stickers placed on your vehicle. Under this agreement, if police officers see your vehicle being driven during the hours of 1 a.m. and 5 a.m., they may stop the vehicle to verify ownership.
