



It is Your Skin; Wear it Well

With summer approaching, it's a great time to review just how damaging the sun can be to our skin. Protecting yourself from the sun's rays could prevent most skin cancers. Sun exposure adds up day after day. It happens whenever you're outdoors gardening, sailing, skiing, fishing, hiking or just walking to and from your car. Sunlight reflects off water, sand, concrete and boat decks. Ultraviolet rays are present even on cloudy days. Everyone is at risk to skin cancer, regardless of skin color, so protect skin and eyes from the sun whenever possible.

Following a few tips can help reduce your risk to skin cancer:

- * Limit sun exposure between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., when the ultraviolet rays are most intense.
- * Slip on a shirt. Choose shirts and pants to protect as much skin as possible.
- * Wear sunscreen. Choose a sunscreen with a Sun Protection Factor of 15 or higher.
- * Wear a hat. Choose a hat that shades the face, neck and ears.
- * Wear sunglasses to protect your eyes from UV rays.



Parents should be advised that avoiding sunburn during childhood and adolescence is very important in reducing the risk of skin cancer later in life. Sunscreen is not recommended for children less than six months old. Keep infants in the shade and protected with clothing. 




this talented and generous lady with us each day. We salute Martha, our Pillow treasure!

“No cylinder can be filled after April 1, 2002 without an OPD.”




A change in the Liquefied Petroleum Gas Code (NFPA 58-1998 edition) requires that all new Department of Transportation (DOT) cylinders manufactured after September 1998 be equipped with an **Overfill Protection Device (OPD)**. The OPD is a new style valve which prevents over filling. Existing cylinders must be retrofitted if they are out of qualification date.

DOT cylinders are those cylinders, which are manufactured under the specification of the U.S. Department of Transportation. These are considered portable and are most commonly used for gas grills, recreational vehicles and recreational use.

Highlights of the Law:

- Section 2-3.1.5, NFPA 58, requires OPD's be on cylinders 4 lbs. through 40 lbs.
- As of July 1, 1999, all cylinders which are out of qualification date must be retrofitted with an overfill prevention device before they may be filled.
- Cylinders manufactured after September 30, 1998, must be equipped with a listed OPD and a fixed maximum liquid level gage, and the device shall be a part of the container assembly.
- After April 1, 2002, no cylinder may be filled unless it is equipped with a listed OPD.



Cylinders equipped with the OPD are identifiable by the different hand wheel configuration. Older cylinders are equipped with the common round hand wheel configuration, while the newer OPD valves have a triangular-shaped configuration. The new hand wheels will be uniform and will bear the OPD stamp.

LP Gas DOT cylinder information:

1. DOT cylinders should never be filled beyond 80% full.
2. The maximum weight of a properly filled DOT cylinder is approximately 38 pounds. Consumers should weigh their newly filled cylinders to insure they are filled properly.
3. There are approximately 20 lbs. of propane in a properly filled DOT cylinder.
4. Cylinders should be stored in a well-ventilated area preferably outside, never inside a living area, and away from other combustible materials.
5. Do not store in direct sun light or in the trunk of a car, since extreme heat can cause a fire or explosion.

The North Shoal Creek Neighborhood Association is a voluntary membership organization formed to improve the community of a north central Austin neighborhood (containing approximately 900 residences, several apartment complexes and many businesses). Our purpose is make our neighborhood (and by extension Austin in general) a better place to live. We do this through a variety of programs :

COMMUNITY AWARENESS

One of our main purposes it to make our residents aware of issues that effect them. We do this by many methods including :

- **General meetings** - At general meetings we open the floor for members to openly discuss neighborhood issues that effect them (like traffic problems, zoning issues, etc.)

- **Speaker meetings** - Several times a year we invite speakers to meeting to discuss topics of interest to the community. These in the past have included the City Police Chief, the City Manager, dispute management counselors, and xeroscape gardening speakers.

- **Neighborhood Night Out** - We have sponsored parties in association with this national program intended to get neighbors to get out and meet one another.

- **Newsletter** - Several times a year we publish a newsletter discussing neighborhood information.

COMMUNITY EVENTS

We sponsor events to bring the neighborhood together to form a more cohesive community, examples are:

- **Spring Fling** - In March we sponsor a picnic with band at the school in our area.
- **4th of July Parade** - On the 4th we organize (including police escort) a parade in our area.
- **Neighborhood Garage Sale** - Once a year we coordinate all the garage sales in our area to happen on the same weekend and advertise it. The neighborhood association recieves no revenue from this.

COMMUNITY REPRESENTAION

We represent our community in various ways to improve our neighborhood.

- **Capital Improvement Proposals (CIPs)** - In the past we have written CIPs when the city of Austin asked for citizen input. Past proposals include drainage improvements and traffic lights.
- **Traffic management** - We have worked with the city of Austin, its police department, and local business to reduce traffic probelmς in our neighborhood. We have gotten a local car dealership to agree to cut test driving in our neighborhood. We have also gotten local business to contribute \$25,000 to help defray the cost to the city of austin to improve traffic and safety in our neighborhood.
- **Attend and represent our Neighborhood at larger community meetings** - We have repre-

sented our neighborhood at various civic functions. We have worked with the library board to put a library in our neighborhood. We have worked with the Captial Area Metropolitan Planning Organization on on traffic and advised the city of Austin Planning commission on zoning issues and variances proposed for our neighborhood.

- **Community Improvement** - While all the areas already mention improve the community in an abstract way, the association also works on physical improvement. We do this in a variety of hands on ways from landscaping community public landscape to placing trash and dog clean up bags in our common public park.

None of our programming require membership, and all of our services are available to anyone in our community - whether they pay dues or not.

Statement of Revenue and Expenses

List the organization's present and future sources of financial support, beginning with the largest source first.

- 1) **Dues** - Dues are the largest source of income from year to year. For this year Dues makes up over 90% of our operating revenues
- 2) **Interest** - Interest is in two components. Nominal interst in our checking account (under \$100 a year) is used directly as revenue. Interest on a large gift (see 4) can be used for general revenue, but has been kept as part of the gift.
- 3) **Ads in Newsletter** - To defray cost of the newsletter. Revenue from adds has never paid (or has intended to pay the complete cost of the newsletter. In recent years we have scaled back the ads.
- 4) **Contributions** - We do not plan for contributions to be a large amount of our revenue. Year to year it is usually under \$100. In 1999 we received a gift of \$25,000 to both incorporate and for traffic abatement. This gift will pay the fees for this form and the rest will go to traffic abatement in the neighborhood when the City of Austin restarts their traffic abatement programs. This money sits in a CD until then.

Just about every afternoon the kids play together in the Davinshines yard.


Losing a Family

We congratulate the families on Little Laura for their claim to fame! We also thank them for continuing the tradition of a friendly, strong, unified neighborhood!


