tive can do to assist you. I promote Neighborhood Watch get neighbors together to meet one another and help ueter crime. Neighborhood Watch can also be used to get neighbors working together to clean up a neighborhood. District Representatives deal with quality of life issues that affect a neighborhood. If someone has a concern about junked or abandoned vehicles for instance the District Representative can be called to deal with those concerns. A junked vehicle is a vehicle that is on private property and is not running, the registration and inspection is expired and can be seen from a public road. An abandoned vehicle is a vehicle that is parked on a public road with an expired inspection and registration and is inoperable. I

There are several things that a District Representa- can be called on both of these and will go out and check them to see if they are in violation. I will work with the owner to bring them into compliance. If not they will be tagged as junked or abandoned and possibly towed if they do not meet a time line. Other quality of life concerns can be trash or a neighbor that has high weeds.

Yard-of-the-Month Winners



Notes from the Treasurer

While it seems like longer, it's only been four years since I became treasurer of our organization. A lot has happened in the four years. When I became treasurer in January 1998 we were a small organization. We had 45 members listed and only 36 paid up; we had only \$1771.29 with an annual expenditure of a little under \$1300. We see very inactive. We had a few meetings with featured guests and excellent newsletter, but little else.

Today things are vastly different. We are an active neighborhood and association. We still have our excellent newsletter and a few featured guest meetings, but we now have the Spring Fling and the 4th of July Parade. We have been active in city issues (school zoning, library placement and MOPAC) and even have created a vibrant parents' group. We are properly incorporated, though we still have a few tax issues to iron out.

From a treasury standpoint we have \$2506.27 plus almost \$27,500 cached in a CD for neighborhood traffic and



safety projects. Last year we spent almost \$4000.00 (with a comparable income). We can achieve this because we now have a listed membership of 250 households with 192 paid up. This last number is a number we need to be proud of. We have 864 households in our neighborhood. This means we have over 1 in 5 of our households as paid members (actually 22.22% for math hounds like me). In some areas of our neighborhood we are closer to 1 in

3. Even the best active neighborhoods like Allendale and Hyde Park boast only 1 in 10, and the typical neighborhood its well below 1 in 20.

At this juncture of growth it is time for me to step down as Treasurer. As the neighborhood has grown so have my family responsibilities. When I started this job my oldest child was still in pre-school. Now both my children are active in elementary school. My activities in other areas have also increased and so I don't have the time to spend month to month on Treasury business. I leave the books in good order.

My family is not disappearing from the organization. There are a few tax issues to finish, which I will finish for the next Treasurer on top of training him for the job. And we will participate actively in the organization. It is critical that people step up and fill the jobs that are being vacated. If not, this lively organization which the leadership of the last few years have created (hats off to Chris Randall and many others) will fade back to the sleepy ganization and neighborhood we were before.
