What is the NSCNA Garage Sale?

The Kindergarten Roundup scheduled for Tuesday, May 6.


Please alert all families with children entering Kindergarten next fall to take advantage of this invitation to visit Pillow and discover its fine Early Childhood teachers and program.

Goals: Paint / Beautify the Exterior of the School, Build Benches and Improve the Gazebo and Plant Gardens

Pillow Elementary and its grounds are due for a facelift. We would like to work with the school on a project to beautify the school and its grounds. This will probably be done in phases as we concentrate on one project at a time. An effort like this will require the involvement of several neighbors contributing some of their time and expertise. The ability to begin this project will depend on the interest of the community.

Austin Fine Arts Festival - April 12th and 13th



Celebrating its 53rd year, the Austin Fine Arts Festival "Puts the ART in Party" by bringing thousands of Central Texans and 210 national artists together in an exciting downtown Austin setting. Formerly "Fiesta at Laguna Gloria", the popular juried art event marked its 50th anniversary by changing its name and relocating downtown to better accommodate its growing number of artists, hands-on art activities, musicians, food vendors and festival patrons. Organized by volunteers, the festival's mission is to raise funds for the Austin Museum of Art and make art more accessible to Central Texans. Admission for adults is \$7; children ages 12 - 6 are free. Art activities are \$1 each.

Location

The Austin Fine Arts Festival 2003 will be held @ 5th at Guadalupe and San Antonio Streets, on the city blocks surrounding Republic Square Park and the future location of the Austin Museum of Art.

 (Guadalupe and 5th), and 300 W. 6th (Guadalupe and 6th)

The Scene

May Day meets Woodstock in this springtime rite of passage, named after the gloomy donkey of A.A. Milne's "Winnie the Pooh" stories. This whimsical annual celebration began in 1963, when UT student Lloyd W. Birdwell Jr. and his friends decided to honor the spring as they imagined Milne's protagonist Christopher Robin might. Locals and visitors continue this tradition, gathering on the last Saturday of April to eat, drink, dance and make merry. Highlights include maypole dancing, birthday cake, a Hippie Queen pageant and a thunderous, Texas-sized drum circle.

The Draw

Hippies mingle with frat boys and families. Some folks are in costume, some in tie-dyes and some unclad altogether. The Hippie Queen pageant draws outrageously costumed competitors, from glittery fairy princesses to elves to the curious "Silver Man," decked out from head to toe in body paint. Vendors provide beer, soda, turkey legs, snow cones and other munchies (including vegetarian options).





The Library is Finally On Its Way!

What library?

In the 1998 City of Austin Bond Election, voters approved the funds to acquire the necessary land, design, and construction of a new, permanent branch library to serve the area now being served by the leased-space North Village Branch. For many years there has been talk and a sign put up at the new location of 2505 Steck Avenue, but no action. It seems that things are finally moving!

What meeting?

February 27th, a public design meeting was held to get input from the community as to what they would like to see in the new library. Suggestions ranged from the look and feel of the library to ideas about a kids section and meeting rooms. The community was told the entire process from design to opening the doors would take between two and a half to three years. There will be more of the community meetings to come where the community will be updated on the progress, shown potential designs and asked for additional feedback.

Have a suggestion, but can't attend a meeting?

If you have thoughts about what you would like to see in the new library, but don't have time to get to a community meeting, you can contact John Gillum, the Library Facilities Manager. Think about volunteering when the library opens.



One of our neighbors' wife works in the Austin Library System and half seriously told me that we may have a library, but no one to work in it. Unfortunately, the library budgets have been cut severely over the last 10 years. If you would like to help in some way, you might think about vounteering at your local branch when it opens. There is an organization called Friends of the Library which is a group of volunteers dedicated to the support of the Austin Public Library. Garden Tips

Things to Do In April

Fertilize

Tomatoes and peppers should be fed with a liquid fertilizer. Feed crape myrtle beneath the branch spread with 1/3 cup complete fertilizer per sq. yd. After second mowing, fertilize lawn with 3-1-2 ratio product; aerate first, if needed. Fertilize all houseplants with complete fertilizer. After blooming, feed bulbs with bone meal. Mulch trees, shrubs, vegetable garden and flower beds (after soil has warmed) with 2-4 inches of mulch. Pine needles and oak leaves make a good mulch for acid-loving plants. Spread coffee grounds around azaleas and other acid-loving plants.



Water - Water as needed.

Transplant - Divide and transplant late summer-and fall-flowering bulbs. Container-grown plants (almost any kind) can go into the ground now. Plant summer annuals to get their root systems established before the extreme heat arrives.

Lawn Care - Plant grass sod or plugs. Water daily for one or two weeks to establish. Begin regular lawn care. Mow every 5-7 days, leaving the clippings on the lawn. Keep St. Augustine grass at 2-1/2 to 3 inches.

Things to Do In May

Fertilize 1 ...

Feed all spring-blooming shrubs after they have bloomed. Feed amaryllis after they bloom. Feed and mulch iris. Feed crape myrtle with 1/2 cup/sq. yd. of 3-1-2 ratio fertilizer beneath the branch spread.

Water - Water annuals as needed. Mulch all bare soil to retain moisture.

Transplant - Container-grown plants can go into the ground now.

Lawncare - Mow every 5-7 days, leaving the clippings on the lawn. Keep St. Augustine grass at 2 1/2" to 3" height. Apply 1/2' to 1" of water as needed to wet soil thoroughly. Don't water more often than every five days.



Diseases/Pests to Look For

Check for aphids and spider mites. Look for tobacco hornworms, spider mites and stink bugs, especially in vegetable gardens. Spray peach and plum trees for curculio weevils. Spray blackspot-susceptible roses with fungicide every 7-10 days.

Prune

Prune spring-flowering shrubs and trees after they bloom. Prune climbing roses and other "once bloomers" as soon as they finish flowering. Divide chrysanthemums and pinch tips for bushier growth. Pinch back leggy annuals to encourage branching. Deadhead plants to encourage blooming. Prune frost-damaged trees and shrubs. Remove sucker shoots from tomato plants to get earlier, larger fruit.
