Yard of the Month

Everyone is concerned about their welfare, and what is going on around them in the neighborhood, but few (at best) ever actually take action. Those that do should continue, and the rest of us need to join them. If you see anything that is 'suspicious' you need to do something. More attention will be given to an area that has placed several calls about a particular problem. If 5 people on the same street call about a suspicious person, chances are you will get a police officer out there patrolling much quicker than if just 1 person calls.

Crime on my Street

We recently had a situation on my street, where there had been a suspicious individual walking the neighborhood and ringing a few doorbells early in the morning. None of us thought much of it. A day later, one of our neighbors walked into her living room to find a strange man in her house. He left quickly with her purse. Apparently this man had been casing our street looking for unlocked doors.

Be Aware and Know Who to Call

Perhaps a vehicle that isn't a part of the normal scene where you are, or a person being somewhere out of the ordinary, or doing something out of the ordinary, or traffic that is a hindrance, or whatever you feel uncomfortable about - do something. Make detailed notes about the situation so you can later identify the scene. Then immediately call someone to report it or discuss it.

- · If it is life or property threatening you should call 911.
- For things that have happened, but not currently happening, and not life or property threatening, call 311 to make a report. (Article continues on next page)

- If you know of a situation when someone needs help personally or for whatever reason, call 211.
- If you observe a commercial vehicle somewhere it perhaps shouldn't be, take the company name, truck
 I.D. number, license number, telephone number, and if possible a description of the person or persons
 with the vehicle, and call that company to inform them of the situation.

Maybe they are using the street as a 'cut-through' regularly. If it's a neighborhood problem that needs the attention of the police department, call our District Representative - currently Jim Riley @ 974-5557. He is good at directing you in the direction of your need. By us not taking any action, nothing will be accomplished. If we ALL continue to call about situations we witness, EVERY TIME something continues to happen, eventually someone will respond to try and correct it. It takes each and every one of us to call, call, and call again to be successful.




The Something's Afoot is Holding On



Located in Austin, Texas: Pioneer Farm is a "living history museum" where costumed interpreters present a picture of the past through the daily management of an 1880's farm in the Walnut Creek Area. The mission of the Pioneer Farm is to preserve and portray prairie life in 1880's central Texas. We believe that by preserving our past, we enrich our future.

We will do this by:

- Educating the public about rural life on the Blackland Prairie in 1880's central Texas
- Preserving buildings, artifacts, and heritage crops and livestock
- Demonstrating historic skills and processes in a living history setting
- Sharing the rich cultural heritage and stories of central Texas' past
- Providing hands-on opportunities to participate in old time skills
