Focus on Safety in our Neighborhood

In the old days some small town newspapers printed a sometimes humorous column called "Police Blotter" which listed all incidents that were reported to the police department. Those days are gone, but we now have the equivalent of the old police blotter news. It's called Crime Viewer, a helpful tool on the APD website. You can now choose data by neighborhood association and see a tally of all crimes reported through APD. Click on a category such as "Burglery of a Vehicle" and you can see the block, date and time and whether it was a business or residence. This is a way for us to gauge trends of criminal activity in our area. By using this tool the safety committee will be monitoring the frequency and location of crime in our area. We will communicate our findings to the block captains and will be in contact with APD about their efforts at addressing problems in our area.

Our APD District Representative, James Hellums, has been working with certain property owners and tenants of commercial property with a higher than average incident rate in our area. For example, on October 24th there was an attempted daytime jewelry store robbery along Anderson Lane. APD had done a prior assessment of the parking lots with the property owner and tenants. Thanks to a quick response, some crucial observers and some luck, they were able to quickly apprehend both suspects and recover the jewelry. APD is aware of the problem spots surrounding our neighborhood and will be making further contacts with business owners to help them deter criminal activity close to our boundaries. The APD website can be accessed at www.ci.austin.tx.us/police. You can locate the Crime Viewer by clicking on Crime Information and then selecting Current Crime Information.

At the time this newsletter is being published we are planning a Thursday, December 1st meeting with all block captains and the Safety Committee. This is in addition to the December 6th General Meeting. At the safety meeting, we are meeting with James Hellums to discuss some recent activity in certain areas of our neighborhood, particularly the Shoal Creek area and Winding Way.

How can you contribute to making our neighborhood safer? Your block captain will be receiving a reference guide labeled APD RESOURCE GUIDE. If you need better street lighting, abandoned cars removed, graffitti removed, etc. this guide will give you a wealth of information about how to get this done with the City of Austin. Your eyes and ears are needed to report suspicious persons in the area to 311 if non emergency, and 911 if a crime is possibly in progress and get a report number. Even though APD may not be

able to do anything about a specific random crime, we want this information visible in the database. The key to making your call show in the database is to obtain a report number, even if you are simply reporting a suspicious person. If the 311 or 911 operator says they don't normally issue a report number, tell them you want one anyway. Keep in mind, the Crime Viewer is not a perfect database of information and APD is working on some upgrades, however, it's a step in the right direction for providing us a way to know what is happening.

Don't have a block captain? Be one! Email blockcaptains@nscna.org and we will provide you with the information and materials you need to be a block captain. It's not difficult or time consuming and we would like the whole neighborhood to be represented with block captains so that we are more connected to what's happening and you should feel more connected to resources available through your neighborhood association.

I am going to quote from an excellent article on the APD website titled "Unlocking the Mysteries of Policing".

"Achieving healthy, safe neighborhoods means building the capacity for citizens to deal with problems that erode the quality of life in their community. It means bringing to bear all the resources of a community, with each entity assuming a fair share of the responsibility for solutions to problems. Residents must unite with community institutions, police and governmental agencies to address the problems in real, "sleeves rolled up" working partnerships. One neighborhood at a time, the cumu lative effect of officers and community resources solving individual neighborhood problems all over the city eventually influences the crime rate for the city at large. As individual neighborhood problems are solved, be it burglary, narcotics, youth crime, or whatever, then the level of safety for the entire city improves."

In other words, if you want something done you must be involved on some level and by working together, we can accomplish our goal of making the neighborhood a safer place to live. Hope to see you at the upcoming meetings and have a safe Holiday Season!


Committee Updates

Safety Committee Sets Goal and Objectives for 2006

I. The Safety Committee will stay informed about incidents in our neighborhood through data maintained on the APD web site and through the Block Captain network. We will work with APD to identify trends and strategies for making our neighborhood safer.

II. We will actively expand and support the Block Captain framework of our Neighborhood Association and strive for a high percentage of representation. We will utilize that framework for educating, informing and gathering information.

- Educate residents about resources available to them through APD including National Night Out in August, the Neighborhood Watch program, the Crime Viewer data, and Commanders Forums.
- Inform interested residents of trends, critical incidents and other types of information so that they make take the appropriate actions.



III. Establish relationships with other governmental entities such as AISD Police dept, City Council members, other neighborhood associations as well as local businesses and commercial residential property to have an ongoing dialogue about safety issues that affect our neighborhood and schools.



With these ambitious goals, the Safety Committee could use some great volunteers who are concerned about the safety of our neighborhood. 


How do you know who won?

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


Newsletter Distribution Coordinators
