

National Night Out is designed to:

- Heighten crime and drug prevention awareness;
- Generate support for crime prevention;
- Strengthen neighborhood spirit and police community relations; and
- Send a message to criminals letting them know that neighborhoods are organized and fighting back!

You can get involved in a variety of ways:

- Get all of your neighbors to turn on their porch lights.
- Meet your neighbors by attending a block party or hosting a barbecue.
- Encourage your kids to get involved. Ask them to make posters and yard signs for the event.
- Invite local law enforcement to talk about crime prevention.
- Distribute a neighborhood block list, phone numbers, etc.
- Plan a fall clean-up or bulb planting.

June General Meeting Minutes


Minutes from Last Meeting were approved. Treasurer's Report was not given. Announcements:







NSCNA Tree Trimming Policy

Hello, my name is Kevin Wier and I wanted to share a concern some of your neighbors have. I live at 8207 Stillwood Lane. As most of you have noticed, Austin Energy has been in our neighborhood trimming and cutting down trees through its contractor, Asplundh (the big orange trucks). They are cutting trees to provide a certain radius of clearance around the top three lines on the power poles that run through our neighborhood.



My wife, Mary Jane, and I received a notice that our trees needed to be trimmed and cut down in January. We disagreed with this assessment and contacted Austin Energy. We had to go through two levels of



protest before we got someone to actually talk with us in any meaningful way. The first two levels we talked with told us they were following policy and there was nothing they could do. The third level person we talked with agreed that the trees didn't actually need to be cut down, just trimmed. They started talking to us about trees on our neighbors' property (one residential, one commercial) that were also marked to be cut down to the ground. So, we began talking with our neighbors and they didn't want their trees cut down either and also disagreed with Austin Energy's assessment that the trees needed to be cut down.

To keep this note short I'll jump ahead 6 months to present date. We have been talking with Austin Energy, the City Manager's office, the Mayor's office, and City Council. Overall, we have not had much success to-date in getting anyone to address our concerns. One hundred and eighty two trees on our block have been cut down to the ground. It's tragic. Most of these trees provided a much needed buffer between the residences on our block and the commercial buildings that share our block.



We are still working to create a dialog with city leadership about this issue. We also are working in partnership with members of the Hyde Park Neighborhood Association who have the same problem. We have been told by Austin Energy that until our neighborhood association has a policy statement on this subject, they won't address our issue as a whole; they will only address it on an individual residence basis. We need to address this issue as a neighborhood to have enough political power to make them listen and address our concerns—namely, to stop cutting down trees that don't need to be cut down.

To this end, I have created a draft of a tree trimming policy. I read this at the June 6th neighborhood association meeting. Our next step on this is to get the statement improved through editing. Jean Armstrong, a professional supervising editor, and Liz Haltom, an attorney, have both generously volunteered to review and edit the policy statement. The statement is written below.

Policy Statement regarding Tree Trimming and Cutting Down in our Neighborhood

Guiding Principle:

Trees add value to our neighborhood and are desirable to have. Trees increase property value, keep temperatures cooler in the summer and warmer in the winter, save money and save energy by requiring less energy to cool and heat homes and businesses, add shade, add aesthetic beauty and well-being, add privacy, create a barrier to noise, including traffic noise, add security, and create a physical barrier or buffer to commercial areas adjacent to our neighborhood.

Trees in Austin create an urban forest. This is desirable and should be protected. Trees are an important part of our lives as energy is. Providing energy can be balanced with other elements of our lives such as trees and the urban forest.

- 1. Austin Energy should suspend all tree cutting in our neighborhood until the Tree Task Force's recommendations (URL) are adopted by the City of Austin.
- 2. Austin Energy shall notify our neighborhood via the NSCNA at least 90 days in advance of cutting in our neighborhood. This notice shall include a detailed and specific description of their plans and the extent of their cutting plans. This notice shall include a physical meeting/discussion at one of our regular neighborhood association meetings.
- 3. Austin Energy recognizes that our neighborhood association must have time to respond to and if necessary oppose their plans before Austin Energy begins cutting.
- 4. We do not want our trees cut down. We recognize that reasonable trimming of branches may be required from time to time. Again, our policy is we do not want our trees cut down.
- 5. If Austin Energy believes there is no other reasonable option but to cutting down a tree, then Austin Energy will notify our neighborhood association and affected property owners and owners of adjacent properties and give all time to respond. If interested parties disagree with Austin Energy's assessment, the issue will be taken to the Austin Environmental Board and the Austin Urban Forestry Board for arbitration/ruling. If any interested parties disagree with this ruling, then the issue will be taken to the Austin City Council for a final resolution.
- 6. Austin Energy will provide appropriate large trees—not seedlings or saplings—or money to purchase large trees for planting to replace any and every large tree that Austin Energy cuts down.
- 7. Before Austin Energy cuts down any tree, they will abide by and follow all City of Austin rules and policies that aim to protect trees, such as policies regarding the issuance of permits to cut down larger trees with a certain trunk diameter. (Note from Kevin: we need to find specifically what these policies are, who issued the policies, etc. I've been told of these policies and heard them discussed at an Austin Forestry Board meeting, but need more details.
