You may have met our new APD liaison, Senior Officer Rolando Gutierrez at a safety meeting held by NSCNA at Pillow Elementary on September 15, 2009. Crime, especially property crime, has risen "at an alarming rate" in our neighborhood in the recent months. Officer Gutierrez addressed residents' concerns and offered tips on how to reduce chances of becoming the thieves' next victim.

Many of the burglaries involved entry through a rear door or window with the garage door being left open upon the burglars' exit. If you see someone suspiciously enter a neighbor's backyard or someone leaving a home with the garage door open, call 911 immediately. Officer Gutierrez suggested using wooden dowels or screws in all windows and patio doors. In addition, lock garage doors if possible and use three inch (3") screws in door plates which make it more difficult for a door break-in. Always lock the door from your home into the garage and any other door access from the garage or other areas into a side or backyard.

Other tips include:

<u>Lights, lights</u>. Set motion detectors from dusk to dawn. Get an inexpensive timer and set inside lights for different times if gone for any length of time.

<u>Alarms</u>. Test them periodically and ALWAYS set them, even when you are home. You can use the "bypass" button to set the alarm while at home.

<u>Solicitors</u>. Don't open the door. Talk to them through the door to tell them you are not interested. This is a common method to "case" your home for valuables and to see if an alarm is at the door. Report any suspicious solicitors to 911.

<u>Shrubs/landscaping</u>. Trim all areas around access doors and windows to eliminate any hiding places.

<u>Garbage/recycling cans</u>. Be neighborly and bring in any cans that have remained after pickup. This can be a signal to potential thieves that you are not home.

<u>Newspapers/mail</u>. Ask a trusted friend or neighbor to pick it up for you and make sure no flyers/advertisements are left on your door.

<u>Garages</u>. Even when home, do not leave the garage door open where tools, lawnmowers and other property can be seen. Lock the garage door as well as your car and DO NOT leave the garage door opener, purses, wallets or other valuables in your car, even if it is in the garage.

<u>Blinds/curtains</u>. Leave them closed. Potential burglars want to see what goodies are inside, especially at Christmas time.

<u>Dogs</u>. Dogs are a deterrent. If you hear a neighbor's dog continuously barking, call 911 and have it checked out.

Thank you for electing me to the NSCNA Board of Directors in 2009. I am running for president of our association in 2010, and I'd like to ask for your support. We can take steps to address this, such as rebuilding the block captain network, working with APD to ensure we get the resources we need, and educating our neighbors on things that can be done to make our area less attractive a target. I could list further interests, but the truth is we are only going to accomplish that which volunteers step up to do. So, as president, I will make a special effort to ensure that our committees are all staffed with strong leadership, and anybody in the neighborhood who wants to participate has an opportunity to have a say. Thank you, and I look forward to a productive, fun, and neighborly 2010 for our association.

The 7th grade Team is participating in the Create Research Study in collaboration with The University of Texas Meadows Center to gather information on effective strategies with English Language Learners. More than 1000 community members came together on a very wet afternoon to celebrate the success and camaraderie among our feeder schools, including Pillow Elementary. Athletic booster and academic clubs sold food, hosted fun activities for kids of all ages, sold spirit wear, and provided entertainment. A pep rally featuring the band, Belles, and cheerleaders concluded the wonderful evening.

Anderson was one of five comprehensive high schools in the state of Texas to be named to the 2009 Texas Business and Education Coalition Honor Roll. Principal Donna Houser traveled to San Antonio November 9 to receive the award, which recognizes commended TAKS performance over the past three years. And speaking of academic recognition, 29 seniors have been named National Merit Commended Scholars for their high PSAT scores. <u>Crime Watch Programs</u>. Report any suspicious activity, no matter how insignificant it may seem. Be aware of your surroundings and familiar activity on your street. Have an email or call list to alert other neighbors to unusual activity. Organize and participate in a crime watch program.

There are a number of websites to track crime reports for the neighborhood and get further safety tips. Two of my favorites are crimedoctor.com and spotcrime on the Austin American Statesman website. The crimedoctor.com website is a very lengthy national website offering tips on every imaginable scenario and has great tips on holiday safety. Spotcrime located at www.statesman.com/spotcrime/ allows you to enter a street address and pull up crime reports for the neighborhood during the last week or month. It provides a street block address, what type of crime was reported and the time and date. It also allows you to log in to the APD website. APD also has a relatively new program called the Austin Police Department Citizen Observer at www.citizenobserver.com where you can sign up for email and/or text message crime alerts.



Paramount to reducing crime in any neighborhood is community involvement; neighbors watching out for neighbors. Officer Gutierrez urges residents to call 911 upon observing any suspicious activity, whether it is a solicitor, a strange or unfamiliar car parked too long or just something out of place in the neighborhood.

Message from Officer Gutierrez

"In some cases there were neighbors who actually observed the burglary suspect/suspects at the scene of the victim residence but, only thought of the situation as being suspicious at the time and never called police to check it out. Only after the homeowner reported that the residence had been burglarized did a neighbor come forward and explain that they had seen suspicious activity at the victim residence prior to its being reported. The police should have been called at the time the suspicious activity was observed.

I'm sending this information out in order for the neighborhood residents to begin taking more precautions in securing their homes and to tell you that if you observe any activity which seems to be suspicious, no matter how insignificant you may think it is, call 911 immediately so that officers can investigate. Better to be safe and report it rather than ignore it and have it be something that probably could have been prevented. Don't leave curtains and windows open where prying eyes can easily look into your home and see what valuable belongings you have ready to be stolen. When you leave your home lock everything.....doors, windows, garage overhead doors and those doors which lead from the garage into your home. If you have home alarm systems please use them both when not at home and even when you are home, especially at night when you go to bed. Use your home alarm systems always! Don't open the door to solicitors. You can simply tell them, through the door, you're not interested and that you want them to leave your property. The first line of defense to preventing or lowering your odds of becoming a victim of a crime begins with you. Be aware of your surroundings, take security precautions and report ALL suspicious activity to the police by calling 911."
