# **Traffic Calming is Coming to Rockwood**

In January 2012, applications for traffic calming were submitted by five residents for their streets. Steck Avenue was ineligible due to not meeting the 85 percentile speeding requirement. Primrose Lane and Ashdale Drive applications were approved but are not funded at this time; they should be considered again in the next funding cycle this year, along with other approved requests.

Two traffic calming applications for Rockwood Lane between Burnet Road and Steck Avenue, and between Steck Avenue and Anderson Lane were approved and funded last year as part of the 13 highest priority projects within the city. The Austin Transportation Department is now developing plans for these streets.

When plans are 60 percent complete the City officials will meet with applicants to review the status of the plans. Once plans are finalized, the contractor can begin construction. No speed bumps or speed humps are now planned for Rockwood.














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# New 10-ONE Amendment and How to Get Involved

In November 2012, city of Austin voters approved Proposition 3, a City Charter amendment commonly referred to as 10-ONE.

The amendment provides for the election of City Council Members from 10 geographic single-member districts, with the mayor elected from the city at-large beginning with the November 2014 election.

Austin residents can apply for the Applicant Review Panel, or the Citizens Redistricting Commission, which will establish the boundaries of the new council districts. Deadline for applications is Feb. 22.

The Applicant Review Panel selects a pool of the most qualified Commission applicants, from which the Commission is created. The Citizens Redistricting Commission is empowered to establish the boundaries of the 10 new council districts for the City of Austin.

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
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## The Safety Committee is Seeking Suggestions

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## **Best Practices for Vehicle Buying**

Buying a car's not always easy, right? First, you have to rule out the dream vehicle that might not fit your budget at the moment. Then, the calculating and the reasoning and the pencil-pushing and the tabulating begins.

We asked some of our members for their tips on getting the best deal on a vehicle. They shared their suggestions on Facebook, letting other members know what might work for them in the car-buying arena. These were a few of their suggestions:

"Know how much you have to spend-in total, not monthly payments!" LeAnn B. Once you have the total figure in your head, you can look at monthly payments using a free online loan calculator. However, if you go into negotiations with just a monthly amount in mind, then some "tricky math" could be used to extend your payments over a longer time period and coerce you into spending more than you wanted.

Research, research, research. Find out the invoice price and the average price of the vehicle in your area." Brandis D. Researching the market is extremely important. Decide which vehicles you might be interested in and then price them online to figure out what is reasonable. Then, you'll be in a position of power once you start shopping in person.

"If trading in, do not share that information until you have negotiated the best price on the car you are buying." Donnetta B. Trading in your car can be convenient, but you want to make sure you're getting the most value from your trade. Find out what the best price is on the new car, then mention your trade-in and see whether you are offered a price that seems fair based on your research.

"Don't be afraid to walk away if you can't get your price at the dealership you are dealing with in person." Dana R. You don't have to make a decision on your first day of vehicle shopping. Make sure to keep your emotions in check and don't fall so in love with a vehicle that it makes it hard to walk away if you don't get the price you're asking for.

"Make sure to visit your local credit union first to get preapproved!" Kevin B. Knowing what you have to spend and the rate you'll be paying for your loan can make you more confident when talking to the seller's and can put you in a better position for bargaining.

Whether you end up in a new or a used vehicle, if you follow these tips and use good financial tips, you can feel good about driving a bargain. As RBFCU member Janet B. said, "When I found the right deal, I felt confident, and I have not regretted my big purchase!"


