Add this date to your calendar: Saturday, October 1st, 9 a.m. to 12 noon, in the cafeteria of Pillow Elementary School, **3025 Crosscreek Drive.** That's the date of and submit your copy of the survey. the kickoff workshop for the North Shoal **Creek Planning Process.**

At the **October 1st workshop**, city planning staff will present background information about our neighborhood and discuss the concept of "complete community" — defined in Austin's current city plan as "a great place that meets your daily needs within a short trip of where you live or work...."

At the workshop **group activities** will help participants identify neighborhood strengths and weaknesses, and a visual **preference** survey will help participants establish a common vision of what the future North Shoal Creek should look like.

In early September, Planning and Zoning Department staff will set up a **website** about our planning process. It will contain a link to an online survey. All North Shoal Creek residents, including renters and property owners, will also receive a postcard with the link to this online survey. For those without computer access, this postcard will tell you where you can get and complete a paper copy of the survey. NSCNA will post that link plus other related information on our website (nscna.org),

Facebook page (facebook.com/nscna), NSCNA Yahoo group, and Next Door North Shoal Creek. Please take time to complete

Our Planning and Zoning Department contact for this planning process is Senior Planner **Jeff Engstrom**. Should you want to contact him, Jeff's phone number is (512) 974-1621 and his email address is jeffrey.engstrom@austintexas.gov.

Additional neighborhood planning meetings are scheduled for November 12th and December 3rd, also in the cafeteria at Pillow Elementary School, 9 a.m. to noon. The process will continue into 2017 with at least two more meetings next year.

These meetings give us an opportunity to define the character of development we want in our neighborhood: its size, shape and impact on neighbors, particularly residential ones. Once the plan we create and its accompanying Future Land Use Map **or FLUM** are approved by the Austin City Council, zoning changes that conflict with the plan and our FLUM will require a plan amendment.

One final, enticing detail: the October 1st meeting includes a free breakfast. Please join us.

President'**s** Corner: Neighbors connecting with neighbors

I love walking my dog! This daily ritual has enriched my life here in North Shoal Creek. It provides an opportunity for me to spend a few moments with neighbors. I get to see former board members or other friends I haven't seen in a while. I've even happened upon a gathering of neighbors having a frontyard splash party, and got to watch the joy on a two-year-old's face as she took my dog's leash and toddled down the sidewalk! I get to meet the neighbors who just moved in down the street and to grab a few minutes to catch up with folks I see regularly.

Austin Oaks PUD update

City staff is still reviewing the Planned Unit Development (PUD) rezoning application which Spire Realty submitted for the Austin Oaks site at the southwest corner of Spicewood Springs Road and MoPac Boulevard.

Since Spire Realty submitted their revisions in April 2016, city staff has provided the applicant with master review reports detailing their concerns with the plans. Spire has responded with revised and updated comments, their latest update coming on August 18th. In the reviews, city staff has suggested application improvements regarding tree removal, open space, transportation, and parks.

Currently the application is set to expire on September 12th, but it is expected that the Zoning and Platting Commission will discuss the application and extend that FolderRSN=11183289 expiration date once more.

Once staff has the updates they need, they will make an ed with any questions about this application at Anoverall recommendation and pass the case to the Envi- drew.Moore@austintexas.gov ronmental Commission for evaluation. A public hearing

before this commission is set tentatively for September 7th, and neighbors will have an opportunity to speak at this hearing.

The Environmental Commission will vote on the application and then pass it back to the Zoning and Platting Commission for a public hearing which will most likely take place on September 20th. That hearing will also be open to public input from neighbors.

From there, the application will be passed to the City Council for approval or denial.



What's in the November \$720 million bond proposal for Burnet Road and North Shoal Creek?

On August 18th, the Austin City Council voted to put a \$720 million transportation bond package on the November ballot. The package includes \$482 million for eight major Austin roads, one of which is Burnet Road, and \$137 million for local mobility projects, including sidewalks, bikeways, urban trails, pedestrian safety, and substandard streets.

Burnet Road is allocated \$80 million of the \$482 million. Improvements will focus on pedestrian safety, additional right and left-turn lanes, intersection improvements, and additional bus pull outs.


Burnet between Koenig Lane/RM222 and Northcross/ St. Joseph Boulevard will be upgraded to meet the City's "Complete Streets" policy, adopted by the City Council in 2014. "Complete streets" endorses creating a multimodal transportation network and includes adding medians and street trees along with upgrading sidewalks and bicycle facilities. The \$137 million of local mobility projects is divided among sidewalks (\$37.5 million), urban trails (\$26 million), bikeways (\$20 million), pedestrian safety and safe routes to school (\$42.5 million), and substandard streets (\$11 million).

Sidewalk funds may cover some of North Shoal Creek's high priority sidewalk needs. Also, a section of shared bike/pedestrian urban trail running north from Shoal Creek Boulevard across 183 and connecting with Neils Thompson Road north of 183 could be eligible for urban trails funding.

A Mobility Bond Voter Information Brochure that outlines the projects that would be funded will be available soon from the City. An online tax bill impact calculator will be provided too.

Be sure to register to vote before October 11th to be able to vote in the November 8th election.

Austin's big sidewalk deficit

Austin, like most American cities, needs more sidewalks. The City's 2016 Sidewalk Master Plan documents not only how many miles of "absent" sidewalks we need to build, but also where they need to go. Using Geographic Information Software (GIS), Austin Public Works Department (APWD) staff analyzed Austin's network of sidewalks and assigned priorities for both repairing existing sidewalks and building new ones. The report along with a map of Austin's existing sidewalk network and a map of its "absent" sidewalk network can be viewed from the Public Works Department's webpage: http://www.austintexas.gov/department/pedestrian-program

How big is Austin's sidewalk problem? Austin has 2,400 miles of existing sidewalks and needs to build 2,580 miles of new sidewalks to connect all the gaps in our existing sidewalk network. This would cost \$1.64 billion. APWD's current budget allocates \$8.6 million for new sidewalks. If we spend \$8.6 million annually, our sidewalk network will be complete in 192 years — not an acceptable option. We need to spend more building new sidewalks.

We also need to better maintain our 2,400 miles of existing sidewalks as well. The average life of a sidewalk is 75 years. To replace our existing 2,400 miles of sidewalks every 75 years would cost \$15 million annually. Recent annual repair spending has ranged from \$250,000 to \$1,500,000, less than 10% of what is needed for adequate sidewalk repair. So, we need to spend more on existing sidewalks too.

How did we get here? The Sidewalk Master Plan points out that 75% of Austin's "absent" or "missing" sidewalks have been annexed over the past 70 years. This happened because, prior to 1969, Austin's land use regulations did not require developers to include sidewalks in subdivisions. Also, it wasn't until 1988 that Austin's City Code was changed to require sidewalks for site developments within the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction. As our city limits expanded, so did our sidewalk deficit.

How do we solve this problem? The Sidewalk Master

Independence Day celebration recap from the Social Committee







CodeNext Update and Austin's Draft Housing Plan

The city's process of rewriting its land development code, called **CodeNext**, is continuing to slowly move forward. The draft code is scheduled to be released for public review and comment on or shortly after the beginning of the new year (2017). You can review what has happened so far and what is upcoming at the city's website: www.austintexas.gov/codenext.

City staff say the best way to provide your feedback and input is to go to www.S peakU pAus ti n.org and write your comments. I also suggest you contact or write our City Council Member, Leslie Pool, and share your views with her. The Austin City Council will ultimately vote whether to approve the new land development code.

This code rewrite will most likely have its biggest impact on our North Shoal Creek neighborhood from changes likely to occur along Burnet Road. Burnet Road has been designated a corridor along which the city would like to double density.

Also, the City's Neighborhood Housing and Community Development Office has issued a draft plan to increase affordable housing within 1/4 mile of activity centers (which in North Shoal Creek means Anderson Lane and Mopac) and corridors (i.e., Burnet Road). You can read the plan at www.aus ti ntexas.gov/housi ngplan.

The increase in affordable housing would be done by opening the activity centers and corridors to being rezoned for affordable housing and missing middle housing (meaning 4-plexes, triplexes, duplexes, accessory dwelling units, and garage apartments) along the edges, and by allowing for smaller houses on smaller lots in neighborhoods near Austin's core. I believe all of North Shoal Creek would potentially be included if the draft plan is approved by City Council.

If you have an opinion about this draft plan, please share it with Council Member Pool and Speak Up Austin.

Plan proposes spending \$25 million a year for 10 years to fund the construction of 39 miles of new sidewalks annually in high and very high priority areas (meaning those within $\frac{1}{4}$ mile of schools, bus stops, and parks). It also recommends spending \$15 million annually to maintain and improve existing sidewalks, which would allow them to be replaced on a 75 year cycle.

What does this mean for North Shoal Creek? The Master Plan's maps show short lengths of extra high priority new sidewalk needed along Ashdale, and several streets south of Steck and east of Rockwood are rated high priority for new sidewalk construction. As for existing sidewalks, most of the sidewalks along Burnet between Anderson and 183 are rated as high or very high priority for repair, as are Anderson Lane, Steck, and Rockwood south of Steck. The repair costs for the sidewalks along Burnet may be funded as part of the upcoming November bond election.

The Austin City Council has approved the 2016 Sidewalk Master Plan, so hopefully the high priority sidewalks needed in our neighborhood will be built out and high priority existing sidewalks rehabbed within the next 10 years. But everything depends, of course, on our City Council consistently approving the plan's funding recommendations. By quantifying, analyzing, and prioritizing Austin's sidewalk problem, the Austin Public Works Department has made a good first step toward solving it. Now we residents need to decide how much we value our sidewalks and how much we're willing to spend on them.




